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BELL SCHEDULE

Southwestern Academy operates on a modified block schedule with seven periods daily Monday, Tuesday, Friday, including P.E., and three block periods plus P.E. on Wednesday and Thursday. Students are enrolled in two semesters. Classes on Monday are 35 minutes in duration, 50 minutes in duration on Tuesday and Friday, and 100 minutes in duration on Wednesday and Thursday.
